John 13:36-38;

36 Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus answered, "Where I am going, you cannot follow me now; but you will follow afterward." 37 Peter said to him, "Lord, why can I not follow you now? I will lay down my life for you." 38 Jesus answered, "Will you lay down your life for me? Very truly, I tell you, before the cock crows, you will have denied me three times.

John 18:7-13

7 Again he asked them, "Whom are you looking for?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." 8 Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. So if you are looking for me, let these men go." 9 This was to fulfill the word that he had spoken, "I did not lose a single one of those whom you gave me." 10 Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right

ear. The slave's name was Malchus. 11 Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword back into its sheath. Am I not to drink the cup that the Father has given me?" 12 So the soldiers, their officer, and the Jewish police arrested Jesus and bound him. 13 First they took him to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year.

John 18:25-27

25 Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They asked him, "You are not also one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not." 26 One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" 27 Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed.

John 21:15-17

15 When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." 17 He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep.

1 Peter 1:1-9;

1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ,
To the exiles of the Dispersion in
Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia,
and Bithynia,

2 who have been chosen and
destined by God the Father and
sanctified by the Spirit to be obedient
to Jesus Christ and to be sprinkled
with his blood: May grace and peace
be yours in abundance.

3 Blessed be the God and Father of
our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great
mercy he has given us a new birth
into a living hope through the
resurrection of Jesus Christ from the
dead,

4 and into an inheritance that is
imperishable, undefiled, and
unfading, kept in heaven for you,
5 who are being protected by the
power of God through faith for a
salvation ready to be revealed in the
last time.

6 In this you rejoice, even if now for a
little while you have had to suffer
various trials,

7 so that the genuineness of your
faith—being more precious than gold
that, though perishable, is tested by
fire—may be found to result in praise
and glory and honor when Jesus
Christ is revealed.

8 Although you have not seen him,
you love him; and even though you
do not see him now, you believe in
him and rejoice with an indescribable
and glorious joy,

9 for you are receiving the outcome
of your faith, the salvation of your
souls.

1 Peter 1:13-15

13 Therefore prepare your minds for
action; discipline yourselves; set all
your hope on the grace that Jesus

Christ will bring you when he is
revealed.

14 Like obedient children, do not be
conformed to the desires that you
formerly had in ignorance.

15 Instead, as he who called you is
holy, be holy yourselves in all your
conduct;

and treasure up my commandments

2 making your ear attentive to
wisdom and inclining your heart to
understanding;
